New York Tax Department Announces Tax Extensions for Ida Victims: On September 2, 2021, Governor Kathy Hochul declared a State Disaster Emergency within the counties of Bronx, Dutchess, Kings, Nassau, New York, Orange, Putnam, Queens, Richmond, Rockland, Suffolk, Sullivan, Ulster, Westchester, and contiguous counties due to the impact of Post-Tropical Depression Ida. As a result of this declaration, the Acting Tax Commissioner has extended certain tax filing and payment deadlines occurring during the period beginning on or after September 15, 2021, and ending on or before October 2, 2021.

Who must complete requirements?

If you meet New York State’s definition of a *commercial tax return preparer*, you have New York State continuing education requirements. These requirements may not be satisfied with either CPE or CLE credits. You can see [Who is a tax return preparer or facilitator](#) to determine whether you meet the state’s definition.

New York Tax Department Announces Waivers for Ida Emergency Responders

The New York State Department of Taxation and Finance released a notice announcing that for the period September 2-December 14, motor vehicles exclusively used for providing disaster assistance, supplies, and equipment in response to Post-Tropical Depression Ida will not be subject to highway use tax (HUT) and International Fuel Tax Agreement credential requirements; HUT and fuel use tax will also be waived for such vehicles traveling in-state during that period.

New York Extends Moratorium on Tax Lien Sales, Evictions

New York Gov. Kathy Hochul has approved a bill that will further extend protections against property tax lien sales, foreclosures, and evictions.

New York Bill Would Provide Relief for Small Rental Businesses

Under S. 7390, introduced September 20 by Sen. Michelle Hinchey (D), taxing jurisdictions could opt not to assess late fees, interest, or penalties on the property taxes of small rental businesses negatively affected by the pandemic. A small rental business is a person or business that operates five or fewer rental units, according to the bill. The legislation would apply to the property taxes owed by the businesses beginning with the state COVID-19 emergency declaration on March 7, 2020, through August 31, 2022

New York Bill Suspends Both Residential and Commercial Evictions

New York S. 50001, signed into law as Chapter 417, implements a new moratorium on COVID-19-related residential and commercial evictions, effective until January 15, 2022, and also prevents local governments from engaging in a tax lien sale or tax foreclosure proceeding until that date.

From NYS DTF: For clients who received unemployment compensation

If you already filed your client's 2020 New York State return and did not add back unemployment compensation that was excluded from their federal gross income, you or your client **must** file an amended return with New York State. If you did not exclude unemployment compensation from their federal gross income, you or your client should **not** file an amended return with New York State.
